Speech Topics and Presentation Summaries:

The Importance of Self-Care: A troubling reality of modernity is that busyness characterizes the average American lifestyle. Go-getters are rewarded while laziness is frowned upon. Yet, what is sometimes lost in one's pursuit of the American Dream is the value of self-care. This presentation highlights what self-care, is not, and why it should be incorporated into one's daily life.

Overcoming Religious Frustrations: Many people harbor negative feelings about some aspect of religious teachings. Others are so dogmatic about their religious convictions that they are unwilling to entertain any criticisms of their faith. With these considerations, this presentation provides a balanced approach between skeptical repudiation and unquestionable commitment.

The Value of a Humanities Education: In modern education, so much emphasis is placed on the importance of STEM fields that humanities-related disciplines are minimized in the process. Yet, much of Western civilization was built upon the foundation that learning the humanities was vital to our existence. This presentation presents valid reasons for both exploring and deepening one's appreciation for a humanities-based education.
