How does CCP work?

- You earn high school and college credit at the same time
 - CCP courses go on your permanent college transcript
 - Not all courses taken through CCP count towards high school graduation
- Some courses are not covered by CCP



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Student Responsibilities



- Attend or log into all classes on time regardless of high school schedule
- Carefully review course expectations on syllabus
- Communicate with instructor directly
- Consider using tutoring services if necessary
- Check Tri-C email regularly!



CCP Probation

State of Ohio rules regarding CCP student probation and dismissal

- When a student receives lower than a 2.0 GPA in their college courses OR
- Withdraws from two or more courses in the same semester past the 14th day
- When on CCP probation the student cannot enroll in more than one college course for the next semester
- If the student received an "F" in a course, they cannot take any course in that subject while on CCP probation





 CCP dismissal will occur when a student is on CCP probation for two semesters

• CCP dismissal will not allow a student to enroll in college courses for the following academic semester

 After one semester of dismissal, the student can request with their middle/high school to once again participate in CCP Comm



CCP Probation and Dismissal

- Please be aware that CCP Probation and Dismissal are Ohio
 Department of Education policies enforced by the middle/high school, not through the college
- If you have specific questions about these policies, please check with your school counselor





Tips for Success



- Get involved, not OVER-involved
- Manage time & schedule realistically
- Have a plan CCP counselor will help!
- Consistently log in to your courses (Blackboard/Brightspace)
- Communicate with professors
- Know your grades
- Become familiar with class syllabus
- Check your Tri-C email regularly!

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Privacy of Student Records

- Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA)
- Federal law that protects educational records of any person enrolled in Post-Secondary education (regardless of age).
- Online FERPA Consent Form available in My Tri-C Space.
- Unless permission is given by the student, the institution is limited to the release of 'directory' information only.



• It identifies prohibited conduct, and clarifies when the Code applies to student behavior.

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

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Accessing My Tri-C Space

- Go to My Tri-C Space: www.my.tri-c.edu
- Click Password Tools and Assistance
- Click Change Your Password
- Enter your S-Number (S0000000); click Continue
- Enter your birthdate (mm/dd/yyyy) as your old password (no leading zeros for singledigit dates)
- Create a new password containing a combination of letters and numbers (e.g., fluffy12)
- Re-enter new password; click Change
- You will be redirected to my Tri-C space
- Log in to your My Tri-C Account using your student email (S0000000@acad.tri-c.edu) and your new password.


Multi-Factor Authentication

Once your password is established, you will be required to set up multifactor authentication (MFA) to access certain Tri-C applications or tools. MFA is required by the college due to federal regulations.



Accessing your Tri-C email

- Access your Tri-C email by signing into my Tri-C space
- The student email icon will appear
- Click on the student email icon.



Accessing your Tri-C email

- Click on the student email icon.
- Type your full S number @acad.tri-c.edu as your email address-ex: S0000000@acad.tri-c.edu
- Use your My Tri-C Space password to log in
- If it is your first time logging in, select the "Eastern Time/US & Canada" time zone
- You will then be directed to your inbox




Online Coursework




Ordering Textbooks




- If book allowance does not cover required costs, estimate the remaining cost of your other books and supplies and email CCP coordinator to have your account increased
- Books are property of the school district that you attend. Please ask them what you should do with the book at the end of the semester. Do not return to bookstore unless the book was a rental.
- Use the book highlight, underline this is your book to use for the duration of the class





- Lost or stolen books student is responsible for the cost of replacement
- You are responsible for correct book purchases-save all receipts and don't open any shrink-wrapped books until you know you will be using them in your class.



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 Special note for homeschooled students: books are the responsibility of the student/parent, but supplies (other than paper, pens, etc.) will be covered- student will need to submit supply reimbursement form found on the CCP page

 Note: Supplies such as calculators, I-clickers, or specialty supplies for programs such as Hospitality Management, that are purchased under the CCP program are the property of the college and <u>must</u> be returned to your CCP coordinator after finals.

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Drop/Add Classes

- Be aware of withdrawal deadlines. CCP students can drop through the 14th day of each session without penalty.

Drop/Add Classes

- Middle/High school may charge you the full cost of the course if dropped after the 14th day.
- There are implications of dropping a class you need as a high school requirement or for athletic eligibility
- You can only add a class that has not yet met-email your
 CCP coordinator for help



Grades & Transcripts

- Report cards are **not** sent home
- Final and mid-term grades are found in My Tri-C Space on the Student tab
- Middle/High schools are sent Tri-C grades for CCP students at the end of each semester
- Students must order transcripts to be sent to other colleges and universities and are \$5.00 per copy
