

Eligibility must be determined prior to placement into college-level coursework. Eligibility rules are put in place at the state level and determine if a student can participate in College Credit Plus.

Step 1 CCP Eligibility

- A. Does the student have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above?
 - YES — **Eligible**
 - NO — See B
- B. Does the student have a remediation-free ACT or SAT score? (ACT English 18+, Math 22+, SAT English 480+, Math 530+)
 - YES — **Eligible**
 - NO — See C
- C. Did the student score a 5 or higher* on a proctored Accuplacer WritePlacer placement test?
 - YES — **Eligible**
 - NO — See D
- D. Did the student score a 46 or higher on a proctored ALEKS math placement test?
 - YES — **Eligible**
 - NO — See E
- E. Did the student have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 2.75-2.99 with relevant coursework** during their first term of CCP enrollment?
 - YES — **Eligible but must take appropriate placement test(s)**
 - NO — **Student is not eligible for CCP**

Proceed to Steps 2 and 3 for eligible students only.

*An Accuplacer score of 5 or higher places student in college-level English.

**Relevant coursework at Tri-C means that a student has completed 10th grade.

Step 2 English Placement

- A. Does the student have a remediation-free ACT (English 18+), SAT (English 480+) or Accuplacer Writeplacer (Accuplacer 5+) score?
 - YES — **Student is placed into college-level English**
 - NO — See B
- B. Does the student have an Accuplacer Writeplacer score of 4?
 - YES — **Student may:**
 - Retake the Accuplacer Writeplacer to earn a score of 5 or higher
 - Take the Tri-C English Placement Test on campus for placement into college-level English
 - Take the Tri-C English Placement Test remotely for placement into college-level English
 - Place into college-level English with a corequisite of English 1001 or 1003. Students should consult with a Tri-C counselor to discuss corequisite selections.
 - NO — **Students in grades 7-10 must take one of the following placement tests:**
 - Accuplacer Writeplacer on campus
 - Tri-C English Placement Test
 - NO — **Students in grades 11-12 see C**
- C. Does the student (in grades 11-12) have an unweighted GPA of 3.0 or higher?
 - YES — **Student is placed into college-level English**
 - NO — See D
- D. Does the student (in grades 11-12) have an unweighted GPA of 2.75-2.99?
 - YES — **Student may:**
 - Take the Accuplacer Writeplacer to earn placement into college-level English

- Take the Tri-C English Placement Test on campus for placement into college-level English
- Take the Tri-C English Placement Test remotely for placement into college-level English
- Place into college-level English with corequisite of English 1001 or 1003. Students should consult with a Tri-C counselor to discuss corequisite selections.
- NO — **Student must take one of the following English placement tests:**
 - Accuplacer Writeplacer on campus
 - Tri-C English Placement Test on campus
 - Tri-C English Placement Test remotely

Step 3 Math Placement

Math placement is required for students who wish to take a math course or a course with a math prerequisite. Use the option that places the student into the highest-level course.

- A. Does the eligible student have a qualifying ACT or SAT score?
 - YES — **Use this chart to determine placement**
 - NO — See B
- B. Is the eligible student's unweighted or weighted cumulative high school GPA 2.5 or above, and have they completed Algebra II and Grade 9?
 - YES — **Base placement on high school coursework. High School Transcript Placement Guide.**
 - NO — **Student must take proctored ALEKS math placement test**
