CMA Up Close: Materials and Processes — Winter Edition

Presented by the Cleveland Museum of Art

This course will offer insights into the materials and processes that artists use in making art and the methods museum professionals use to conserve and exhibit them. Hear perspectives from conservators, preparators, curators and educators on the materials, making, care and display of art. 
