*The Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Continuing Scholars Program is a unique partnership between Cuyahoga Community College and the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Honors College at Cleveland State University. **Students who are selected for the program are neither guaranteed admission to CSU nor required to attend CSU if they are accepted.** Mandel Continuing Scholars participate in a summer research seminar between their first and second years at Tri-C, receiving a \$2,500 stipend. In the spring of their second year, they are issued laptop computers. Up to 25 second-year students are admitted to CSU's Mandel Honors College, where they receive full in-state tuition scholarships to complete their bachelor's degrees after graduating from Tri-C.

†The Mandel Scholars Academy strives to ensure that every student in the program has at least one opportunity to participate in an overnight educational trip during their time at Tri-C. Examples include three-day trips to academic conferences and weeklong trips organized around a cultural or historical theme. All expenses for these trips (i.e., travel, lodging, food, registration fees and admission fees) are paid by the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Humanities Center.

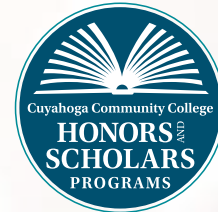
REQUIREMENTS AND EXPECTATIONS



JACK, JOSEPH AND MORTON MANDEL SCHOLARS ACADEMY

Students admitted to the Jack, Joseph and Morton Mandel Scholars Academy commit to:

- Enrolling in at least 12 credits during each fall and spring semester and earning an associate degree from Tri-C within two calendar years of entering the program
 - Completing three required Academy courses with an A or B in each:
 - HUM-1020: The Individual in Society
 - UST-1120: History of Cleveland
 - HUM-2020: Community Engagement Through the Humanities
- Maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Completing a minimum of three CLEadership activities each semester
- When appropriate, enrolling in additional humanities coursework to meet elective requirements and ensure full-time enrollment



Students admitted to the Honors Program Fellowship commit to:

- Enrolling in at least 12 credits during each fall and spring semester and earning an associate degree from Tri-C within two calendar years of entering the program
- Completing three **honors** courses (classes, honors contract or independent studies) with an A or B in each
- Maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or higher
- When appropriate, enrolling in additional honors coursework to meet elective requirements and ensure full-time enrollment.
- Participating in at least 10 honors-related activities or events
