16 elective credits must be earned in order to reach the graduation credit hour requirement of 120 credit hours for the award of a Bachelor of Science Degree. These may be taken at IWU, Tri-C or any regionally accredited institution.

This Transfer Pathway represents one example of how to complete the AAS and BS degree. Students should work closely with advisors at both institutions to discuss options. Students should work with an IWU advisor to identify an official plan of study for bachelor completion

The following courses should be selected as part of the AAS:

• Though not included in the AAS plan of study, students may decide to take 1 English Oral Communication Course, and Philosophy Course and an Arts/Humanities (Art, Foreign Language, Humanities, Literature, Music, Theatre) course at Tri-C in order to fulfill additional IWU General Education Requirements. Once a student has earned an associate degree additional course may not be eligible for financial aid, please see a Counselor or a campus Financial Aid Office for assistance.

Benefits

This program awards maximum credit for an associate degree from Cuyahoga Community College, streamlining completion of a bachelor's degree from IWU. IWU will accept the transfer of your ENTIRE Associate Degree and ALL prior credits provided they meet the following criteria:

- Credits are from a regionally accredited institution
- A grade of "C" or higher was earned
- The courses were 100-level or higher (not pre-college, remedial, developmental, credits through testing or assessed learning)

All students must complete:

- A minimum of 120 semester credits (combined Tri-C and IWU)
- Meet all residency requirements (30 credits for IWU)
