<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> At their time of admission, a student must submit a copy of their state licensure to an academic advisor in the College of Public Health. State licensure must be valid through the student's graduation term. Students who submit a copy of their state licensure may be granted 12 hours of upper division credit.

## **Graduation Requirements**

Requirements to graduate with the BS degree program: To graduate, students must have minimum 120 credit hours, 39 upper-division credit hours of coursework, a minimum 2.000 major GPA and minimum 2.000 cumulative GPA. They must also fulfill an approved experiential learning experience, a two-course diversity requirement (domestic and global), complete a writing intensive course with a minimum C (2.000) grade.
